

Enrollment Shows Increase of Sixty

Oct 1929

Records Note Gain of 400 in Six
Years—206 Seniors Listed,
35 January Grads

With a gain over that of last year, North's enrollment shows a total of 1,176 registrations. When compared with last year's record for the first semester, besides an increase of 60 students over the enrollment last year, North's steady growth is shown by the fact that when the school opened five years ago, there was an enrollment of 776.

Among the students new to North this year and who hail from distant places are Elizabeth Pickering, 9A, late of Lincoln High in Honolulu, H. I., Maxine O'Hara, 12A, Gardena, Cal., Milton Beckley, 9A, of Greenfield, Cal., Benjamin Hicks, 10A, of Lexington, Ky., Bill Dickey, 10B, of Twin Falls, Idaho, and Howard Tipton, 10B, of Denver, Colo.

The January senior class is composed of 35 members. This is somewhat smaller than usual, because of a change in the plans of many students who are staying over to be graduated with the June class, rather than at mid-year.

First day records show that students from five other Omaha high schools have entered North. Fifteen students have come from Tech, three from Creighton Prep, three from South, six from Central, and three from Benson. One student has also enrolled from Thomas Jefferson.

As usual, the freshman class had the largest enrollment. This time there are 386 freshman, with the sophomores not so far behind, numbering 341. The juniors take third place with 242, and the list is completed with 206 seniors.
